As we indicated last weekend, we will leave a donation box and envelopes at the back of the church for the next three weeks for Lent (12th/13th; 19th/20th, 26th/ 27th March) for anyone who wishes to contribute to our Parish Appeal for Ukraine. The bulk of the refugees are going to Poland and Romania and the churches in these countries will be doing all they can to house and accommodate refugees in parishes, convents and monasteries. It is our intention to send all our donations to the Papal Nuncio to Poland, Archbishop Pennacchio and to the Papal Nuncio to Romania, Archbishop Maury (both of whom have visited Ratoath in the past). They will very quickly be able to distribute the monies raised, to parishes that are providing accommodation and essential needs to those most in need.

The Synod and the Ratoath Deanery

All parishioners are welcome to attend one of the Synod meetings to be held in the Parish Hall in Ashbourne on Tuesday 15th March at 8pm or Tuesday 22nd March at 8pm.

People who are active in parish life are encouraged to attend one of the consultation meetings. On **Tuesday I5**th **March at 8.00pm** those involved in the liturgical life of the parish (e.g. readers, extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, choir members, organists, stewards/ collectors, sacristans etc) and those involved in prayer and apostolic groups (Society of St Vincent de Paul, Legion of Mary, Apostolate of Eucharistic Adoration, Teams of Our Lady, Meals on Wheels etc) are invited to attend.

On **Tuesday 22nd March at 8.00pm** those involved in the administration of parish life (e.g. parish staff, members of Parish Pastoral Councils, members of Parish Finance Committees, members of Baptism Teams, Safeguarding Representatives, counters, etc) and those involved in schools (e.g. pupils/students, teachers, school staff, members of parents' associations, members of BoMs, etc) are invited to attend.

However if you can't make the night that your group is assigned, please come on the other night.

And **most importantly**, if you are not a member of any of the above groups, you are most welcome and we want you to come along. The meeting will benefit from your presence and participation. And please feel free to bring someone along with you. **Everyone is welcome.**

During the Season of Lent, we encourage everyone to return to Sunday and weekday Mass in our churches, welcoming each other back as we gather once more together. From Easter Sunday, 17 April, this will once again be deemed an essential expression of faith for all in our Church in Ireland. As always, those whose health is vulnerable or who are unwell will not be under any obligation to attend Mass, and should keep themselves safe and pray at home until they are better.
