**This Sunday is Vocations Sunday**, a Sunday dedicated to praying for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The collection at Masses this weekend is for vocations.

## **Excerpt from the message of Pope Francis for Vocation Sunday**

In fact, "by virtue of the Baptism received, every member of the People of God has become a missionary disciple. Every baptized person, whatever his function in the Church and the degree of instruction of his faith, is an active subject of evangelization" ... The whole Church is an evangelizing community....

The word "vocation" should not be understood in a restrictive sense, referring only to those who follow the Lord on the path of a particular consecration. We are all called to share in Christ's mission to reunite dispersed humanity and to reconcile it with God. More generally, every human person, even before living the encounter with Christ and embracing the Christian faith, receives with the gift of life a fundamental call: each of us is a creature willed and loved by God, for whom he had a unique and special thought, and this divine spark, which dwells in the heart of every man and woman, we are called to develop it in the course of our lives, helping to make a humanity grow animated by love and mutual acceptance.

In this great common vocation, the most particular call that God addresses to us is inserted, reaching our existence with his Love and directing it to its ultimate goal, to a fullness that even exceeds the threshold of death. So God wanted to look and look at our life.

Vocation, like holiness, is not an extraordinary experience reserved for a few. How "holiness next door" exists, so also the vocation is for all, because all are looked upon and called by God.

As Christians, we are not only called, that is, each one personally challenged by a vocation, but also *conopportune*. We are like the tiles of a mosaic, beautiful already if taken one by one, but that only together make up an image. We shine, each and every one, like a star in the heart of God and in the firmament of the universe, but we are called to compose constellations that orient and illuminate the path of humanity, starting from the environment in which we live. This is the mystery of the Church: in the conviviality of differences, she is a sign and instrument of what the whole of humanity is called to.
