Trócaire's Lenten appeal in support of impoverished people in Zimbabwe

For Lent 2022 the Trócaire Lenten appeal continues its focus on East Africa and in particular the people of Zimbabwe and the devastating impact Covid-19 and climate change have had on the country. Trócaire has been working in Zimbabwe since 1980 providing humanitarian aid and food security as well as work on women's empowerment and human rights.

Families in Zimbabwe have been struggling with the triple challenges of Covid-19, climate change and a devastated economy which are exacerbating the daily struggles they face. According to the World Food Programme, 63% of the Zimbabwean population of over 15 million live under the poverty-line. Before the coronavirus outbreak, 7.7 million Zimbabweans faced food shortages after a drought and cyclone in 2019, and ongoing drought in the last year has exacerbated the situation. This has been compounded by rampant inflation.

Ratoath Parish - Ukrainian Refugee Appeal

€15,700 donated our appeal.

Many thanks for your incredibly generous donations.

We have transferred €9,000 to a parish in Romania on the request of Archbishop Miguel Maury, the Papal Nuncio to Romania (who has visited Ratoath in the past).

This parish is St John's Parish in Suceava. If you search *Google Maps*, you will see that Suceava is close to the border of Ukraine. The parish is offering accommodation, meals and support to refugees, most of whom are women and children. This parish is in the diocese of lasi, Romania and a number of priests from that diocese are ministering in the diocese of Meath.

The remainder, €6,700 we have transferred to Archbishop Pennacchio, the Papal Nuncio to Poland. Below is a letter received from the Archbishop on Thursday last.

Dear Fr Gerry,

I wish to thank you most sincerely for the very generous donation of €6,700 from the people of Ratoath to assist the Church in Poland in caring for the unprecedented number of refugees from Ukraine who have arrived in this country.

Currently there are 130 Church centres in Poland giving out up to 47 thousand meals a day. Many refugees left Ukraine with just the clothes on their back so Polish parishes and religious orders are providing them with basic needs, such as food, water, clothes, blankets, pillows, and linen. I am giving the donation from Ratoath parish to the Consolata Fathers who are assisting with this outreach on the ground.

Earlier today, I had an audience with Pope Francis. The Holy Father expressed his gratitude for all the actions taken by the Church in Poland. The generosity from Ratoath and elsewhere is helping the Church to continue this vital mission of solidarity and charity.

I still have happy memories of my visits to Ratoath during my service in Ireland. I take this opportunity Fr Gerry to renew my warmest and heartfelt good wishes to you and your parishioners.
