Sacramental Preparation Dates

A First Confession & First Holy Communion Registration Meeting took place last Tuesday for the parents of those preparing for these wonderful sacraments in which they will grow in faith and love of God. The meeting was addressed by members of the Pastoral Council who presented the *Grow in Love* programme that will be followed, and the dates were given for the **Family Masses** they will attend in the coming months.

Confirmation Enrolment and Commitment ceremony will take place at the Vigil and I I am Mass on the weekend of 8th/9th November for those preparing for Confirmation on Friday 6th February.

Vocations update - as some will have heard in recent news items and interviews on radio and television, there is a total of 70 men currently preparing for secular/diocesan priesthood in the whole country across the seven-year period of formation, including 13 new entries this year.

In the Diocese of Meath we have a total of 6 in training, including two who have just started the *propaedeutic* year, a year in which they deeply consider, discern and reflect on their vocation and will be guided as to the course of their studies and the reality of their future ministry in a diocese with 69 parishes and 150 churches, some 400 schools and a growing population.

At present, in our diocese, we rely on the generosity of some 23 priests from Romania, Nigeria, Ghana and elsewhere who work with our native clergy and faithful to enable parish life to continue.
