

The Annual Diocesan Conference to implement the Pastoral Area structures and new Deaneries took place last week over two days with the clergy of the 69 parishes of the diocese in attendance with the bishop and invited speakers. Our Pastoral Area is Ratoath, Dunshaughlin, Ashbourne, Ardcath/Clonalvy, Curragha & Skryne) comprised of - 6 parishes, 10 churches, 18 Vigil/Sunday Masses and 8 priests. In response to changed demographics and fewer clergy and mass-goers a new strategy is needed to make the most of our priests and other resources. The 8 Deaneries now become 6, ours now being all the parishes of the pastoral areas of *Trim, Ratoath & Dunboyne*. There will be 14 Pastoral Areas across the diocese in which clergy, parish councils, lay faithful and volunteers will collaborate on all areas of faith formation, liturgy and the mission of the Church. The Assembly discussed the rescheduling of masses in all parishes, both a reduction of Sunday masses and alternative times to enable clergy cover for one another when needed, but no decisions will be reached or implemented until Pastoral Councils and parishioners have been informed and consulted.



Pastoral Council – all are invited to a cup of tea and a chat in the Pastoral Centre after I Iam Mass on the First Sunday of Advent. Our Pastoral Council has also organized a meeting this Tuesday with Reps from the other Councils of our Pastoral Area to brief them on the discussions and decisions at the Diocesan Assembly.

Pastoral Letter - The Future of our Parishes: Bishop Dennihan's Pastoral Letter is addressed to all the clergy and faithful of the diocese. It emphasizes the importance of the parish structure, the implementation of the new Pastoral Areas, the provision of Sunday Mass, and plans for a future with a very different profile of clergy and changed demographics. Copies of the Pastoral are available at the back of the church.

40 Hours Adoration at the Cathedral in Mullingar: to celebrate the *Solemnity of Christ the King* at the Cathedral, with Mass at 7:30 pm on Friday 21st Nov and concluding with Solemn Vespers and Benediction at 4 pm on Sunday 23rd.
