Feast Days in the Coming Week

Monday – The Nativity of St John the Baptist

ursday – Feast of St Cyril (370-444) Patriarch of Alexandria and was at the Council of Ephesus in 43, where Mary was proclaimed the Mother of God

Friday- **Feast of St Irenaeus**, born about the year 130 AD. He was brought up in Smyrna and was a disciple of St Polycarp. He became bishop of Lyons, the largest trading centre in Gaul. Tradition has it that he was martyred around the year 200.

Saturday- **Feast of St Peter and St Paul**. St Peter became the leader of the apostles and the rock on which the church is built, died by crucifixion in Rome around the year 64AD St Paul, became the "apostle of the Gentiles" was martyred by beheading around 67 AD

The basket collection taken up at all the Masses this weekend is the **Peter's Pence Collection**. This collection, taken up in every church throughout the world, supports the work of the Pope as he respond to the needs of the church and through the charitable works of the Pope on behalf of those most in need.
