## The Announcement of the Date of Easter at Epiphany

This is a custom that dates from a time when calendars were not readily available and it was necessary to make known the date of Easter in advance, since many celebrations of the liturgical year depend on its date. The number of Sundays that follow Epiphany, the date of Ash Wednesday, and the number of Sundays that follow Pentecost are all computed in relation to Easter. Although calendars now give the date of Easter and the other feasts of the liturgical year, the Epiphany proclamation still has value as a reminder of the centrality of the resurrection in the liturgical year and the importance of the great mysteries of faith which we celebrate each year. On the Solemnity of the Epiphany, the proclamation takes place at mass after the Gospel, or after Communion (or in the bulletin) according to this ancient formula:

The Proclamation of Easter and Moveable Feasts for the Year of Our Lord 2025

Know, dear brothers and sisters, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of His Resurrection, who is our Saviour.

On the fifth day of March will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the holy season of Lent.

On the twentieth day of April we will celebrate with joy **Easter Day**, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the first day of June will be the **Ascension** of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the eighth day of June, the feast of **Pentecos**t.

On the twenty-second day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, **Corpus Christi**. On the thirtieth day of November, the **First Sunday of the Advent** of our Lord Jesus Christ, to Whom is honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Remember, **Christmas is not just a day** it is an Octave of eight days and a season in which we celebrate day after day at table, in company, in worship, prayer and praise while attentive to the lonely and those in need. Keep the festive season going! Say 'Happy Christmas' for the 12 of Christmas until Epiphany, on 6<sup>th</sup> January.

**Christmas thanks**: in addition to those mentioned in last week's bulletin, particular thanks to our very effective and courteous **ushers** at the busy masses on Christmas Eve who ensured a smooth and orderly movement of people for Communion.

Also, to our **collectors** who had to negotiate huge crowds and full pews at the Offertory collection to make sure no one was left out!

Renewed thanks to the Children's Choir, Folk Group, Parish Choir, Cantors, Soloists and Organists.

**Webcam: apologies** to those disappointed at the I I am & I 2.15pm Christmas Day masses which did not broadcast as the wifi link between the church and Parochial House was interrupted just before the I I am Mass and not noticed and fixed until after the I 2.15pm Mass.

We will try to get a more reliable system and service in future.

**First Friday of the New Year:** Mass will be offered for those whose names are on the Altar List of the Dead. No scheduled Communion calls as the housebound were visited the week before Christmas.

**Parish Pastoral Assembly**: a summary of the recent parish '*listening event*' and the feedback received will be given in the bulletin as soon as space permits.

**Publication of weekly collection**: to keep parishioners informed, as of New Year the amount contributed to the weekly Offertory /basket collection will be given in the bulletin, as is already done for the Envelope collection and Standing Orders twice a month.

Monthly sponsorship of the bulletin is available to suitable local businesses and other interested parties. The cost is €100 per month which will cover the annual cost of the new A3 format pre-printed colour bulletin. Sponsorship will be acknowledged in agreed, appropriate wording each week for the month sponsored.
