Words of Pope Francis at the end of the General Audience on Wednesday last

I would like to take a minute to remember the victims of the war. The news of displaced persons, of people fleeing, of people killed, people wounded, of so many soldiers fallen on both sides, is news of death.

We ask the Lord of life to deliver us from this death of war: with war everything is lost, everything. There is no victory in a war: everything is defeated.

May the Lord send His Spirit to make us understand that war is a defeat of humanity, which we need to defeat, all of us; that waging war is a need that destroys us, and to deliver us from this need for self-destruction.

We pray, too, for leaders to understand that buying weapons and making weapons is not the solution to the problem. The solution is to work together for peace and, as the Bible says, to turn weapons into instruments for peace.

Ratoath Parish - Ukrainian Refugee Appeal

€9,795 donated our appeal to date.

Many thanks for your incredibly generous donations.

We have already transferred €9,000 to a parish in Romania on the request of Archbishop Miguel Maury, the Papal Nuncio to Romania (who has visited Ratoath in the past).

This parish is St John's Parish in Suceava. If you search *Google Maps*, you will see that Suceava is close to the border of Ukraine. The parish is offering accommodation, meals and support to refugees, most of whom are women and children. This parish is in the diocese of lasi, Romania and a number of priests from that diocese are ministering in the diocese of Meath.

This is our final weekend for our parish appeal for Ukraine. We will leave the donation box and envelopes at the back of the church for anyone who might like to contribute to the appeal. If you have already contributed to this appeal, we thank you most sincerely.

It is our intention to send all our donations as quickly as possible to parishes that are providing accommodation and essential needs to those most in need. In sending the donations from the parish, we will be guided by the Papal Nuncios in Poland and Romania who are on the ground and will ascertain where the need is greatest.

From the Irish Bishops - On the Situation in Ukraine

"At this time of trial, we want to stand in prayerful and practical solidarity with the Ukrainian community here in Ireland and also to acknowledge the many Russians in our midst who bear no responsibility for this tragic situation. What we are witnessing during these days impels us again to appeal for diplomacy and dialogue – to work for a genuine human fraternity - as the only way to resolve differences and conflicts.

As tens of thousands of refugees arrive in Ireland in the near future, there is no doubt that the Gospel is calling on us to open our hearts and our homes. We welcome the waiving of visa requirements for Ukrainians seeking refuge in Ireland and in other EU countries.

In order to help Ukrainians recover from the trauma and violent displacement that they have experienced, we encourage everyone to welcome refugees in a sensitive and compassionate manner."

"Already millions of people have been forced to flee their homes as refugees. It is a source of inspiration that people all over Ireland are responding with customary generosity to support humanitarian efforts in this crisis. Many parish communities have already established links with charitable projects to support refugees and those remaining in Ukraine. Recognising these urgent needs, the bishops are asking that a special collection be taken up at all Masses on the weekend of Sunday 27 March."
